Only four months have passed since "His Master's Voice" introduced Miliza Korius to the public, and such is the wonder of her voice and the fresh charm of her singing that we have been inundated with requests and suggestions for more Korjus records. This is of two of the most famous coloratura airs. and more than confirms the high opinion we formed on the evidence of her first record. She sings the fiendishly difficult variations on a Mozart tune (closely related to Baa, Baa, Black Sheep) with perfect ease and in the true tradition.

MAREK WEBER AND HIS ORCHESTRA

Although "Tosca" ends only when all the principal characters have met violent deaths, the score is most attractive; exquisite love music for the hero and heroine and sinister music for the villain, with a wealth of vividly descriptive music for the dramatic action. Weber has chosen the best excerpts and welded them into a splended potpourri which he plays with all the brilliance of which he is the master.

Heifetz follows up his outstandingly successful reappearance on "His Master's Voice" (that superb performance of Mozart's A major Violin Concerto published last month) with two pieces that he has made his own. Moszkowski's Guitarre is a favourite tune and Heifetz plays it with caressing tenderness and Southern fire, and in Alt Wien he gives us some playing of astonishing strength and intensity.

HEIFETZ

In the early days of the nineteenth century the great violinist Paganini was held in superstitious awe. His contemporaries, amazed at the prodigious feats on the violin that he performed with every show of ease, said that such accomplishments were beyond the power of men, and consequently said that Paganini was in league with the Devil. To-day we are wiser, and when we hear a great violinist perform those same "miracles" we know that we are in the presence of a master. This Caprice was one of Paganini's favourite pieces, written to display his gifts to the fullest advantage. But if ever musical achievement has deserved the epithet "superhuman" it is Heifetz's playing on this record.

This G minor Quintet is known to Connoisseurs of Mozart as one of the very finest works the master wrote. It was written at a time when the composer was seriously ill and his mind was obsessed with thoughts of death—and as if conscious that he had so little time to live he gave to the world in this work some of his greatest and most expressive music. It is not a light, frivolous work, four of its five movements are intensely serious, and it is only upon close acquaintance that many of its subtle beauties reveal themselves. Everyone who loves beauty should take the opportunity these records offer of learning to love a work that will remain his treasured friend for life.

BERLIN STATE OPERA ORCHESTRA (Conducted by Fritz Zaun)

In Vienna they will tell you that Bruckner is the only composer, apart from Brahms, who ranks with Beethoven. In this country we have had too few chances to judge the rightness of the Viennese estimate, but this record, together with C2659, places us all in a position of forming our own estimate. Bruckner was undoubtedly at his best in his Scherzi, and if only all the movements in his Symphonies had the fine beauty and fire, the richness of invention and superb orchestration that these two Scherzi show, there is every likelihood that the Viennese opinion would be freely endorsed here.
